

Province of Bohol

- ▶ Bohol as an island province in Central Visayas consists of 47 municipalities with Tagbilaran City as its capital. There are 1,109 barangays that comprise its administrative area of jurisdiction grouped into three congressional districts. Bohol as a first-class province and the 10th largest island in the Philippines, has a land area of 4,117.26 sq.km. with a total human population of 1.313 million.
- Agriculture is one of the economic drivers of Bohol and is the main source of livelihood of majority of Boholanos. The development efforts of the province are guided by its vision of Green Bohol, a Competitive and Sustainable Agro-Industrial Province in the Visayas.

Challenges in Governance

- > Bohol as key livestock production area in Region 7
- More than 80% of livestock production done at backyard level
 - ☐ Low productivity
 - o poor bio-security = prevalence of infectious diseases
 - o parasitism
 - o low quality stock of farm animals
 - o high cost of feeds, veterinary drugs & biologics
 - o Inaccessibility to technical/veterinary services

Objective

➤ **Generally,** the Program aims to increase the livestock manpower in the province & capacitate the barangays in attending to the livestock and poultry needs of their constituents.

> Specifically

- ✓ Designate at least one volunteer livestock aide in every barangay;
- ✓ establish an updated Barangay Livestock Profile;
- ✓ enhance adoption of production technologies;
- √ implement basic animal health care program;
- ✓ establish communication network for veterinary surveillance at the barangay level.
